**APRIL 18 Devastating Losses:
New Understandings, New Directions**

Program Description (CEs pending):

This workshop will look at bereavement through twin factors: the nature of the relationship with the deceased, and the nature of the death – and how they can combine to create complicated grief. After a brief review of new bereavement models and research findings, we will use these twin perspectives to understand why some losses become much more difficult than others. We will also explore the implications of this perspective for assessment and intervention, focusing on new techniques for helping the bereaved to deal with both the trauma of the death, and the loss of the relationship. The information presented will have wide applicability to work with people who have lost any important relationship. The conference will be informed by research and clinical experience, and will include the use of didactic lecture, case discussion, and audiovisual presentation.

Participants will be able to:

1. Identify several emerging theoretical developments in the way the mourning process is being understood and describe differences and similarities in trauma and complicated grief responses.
2. Recognize risk and protective factors for the development of complicated grief responses.
3. Describe a foundational model for the roles of the grief counselor.
4. Describe several promising new treatment techniques for complicated and traumatic grief.

**APRIL 19 Grief After Suicide:
Understanding Consequences
and Caring for the Survivors**

Program Description (CEs pending):

This half-day workshop will provide a focused overview of the impact of suicide on survivors, with clinical and support responses that are needed after a suicide occurs. The workshop will include didactic presentation, group discussion and case examples from the speaker's practice. Topics covered will include; a brief review of the epidemiology and contributing factors involved in most suicides; the psychological impact of suicide on survivors; common themes in the bereavement of survivors; risk factors for complicated grief after suicide; and postvention options to help survivors.

Participants will be able to:

1. Identify five common themes in grief after suicide.
2. Assess for risk factors for complicated grief responses in survivors.
3. Understand the benefits of various intervention options for survivors.

Program Description (CEs pending):

The suicide of a loved one can have a profound impact on those left behind. Grief after suicide may entail high levels of disorientation, guilt, regret, anger and trauma. This workshop will draw on the presenter's years of experience as a grief counselor specializing in work with suicide loss survivors to describe the remarkable pathways of healing that survivors can walk. Topics will include the impact of suicide on individuals and the family as a group; some of the myths of grief recovery; ways that survivors can help themselves; and when to seek professional help. The workshop is geared towards people grieving the loss of a loved one to suicide and will be of value to those supporting grieving survivors.

About the Presenter:

Dr. John (Jack) Jordan is a licensed psychologist in private practice in Wellesley, MA, and Pawtucket, RI He was the Founder and the Director until 2007 of the Family Loss Project, a research and clinical practice providing services for bereaved families. A Fellow in Thanatology from the Association for Death Education and Counseling (ADEC), Jacke has specialized in work with survivors of suicide and other losses for more than 30 years.

As the Clinical Consultant for Grief Support Services of the Samaritans in Boston, Jack is helping to develop innovative programs for suicide survivors. He is also the Professional Advisor to the Survivor Council of the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention (AFSP). In 2006 Jack was invited to become a member of the International Workgroup on Death, Dying, and Bereavement, and was the recipient of the ADEC 2006 Research Recognition Award.

For over 25 years, Jack has provided training nationally and has also helped to organize and lead many healing workshops for suicide survivors. He has published over 35 clinical and research articles, chapters, and books in the areas of bereavement after suicide, support group models, the integration of research and practice in thanatology, and loss in social systems. He is the co-author, with Bob Baugher, of *After Suicide Loss: Coping with Your Grief* and is the co-editor, with John McIntosh, of the book *Grief After Suicide: Coping with the Consequences and Caring for the Survivors* (Routledge, 2011). He is also the co-author with William Feigelman, John McIntosh, and Beverly Feigelman, of the recently published book *Devastating Losses: How Parents Cope With the Death of a Child to Suicide or Drugs* (Springer, 2012).
